# **Omicron Thrives on So Many Levels**

As the 2012-2013 academic year begins, the Omicron Chapter of the Phi Kappa Tau Fraternity finds itself poised for another successful year. Omicron starts the year with 70 active brothers and 41 in-house! That means we have a completely full Chapter House and the Cutler/Annex property. Besides great recruitment, the Chapter has been making us proud in other ways.

#### **THON**

THON Chair Andrew Nass, a junior studying Biobehavioral Health, led this year's recordbreaking efforts. He reported that Phi Tau's main goal as a chapter was to beat our previous years' THON totals. The undergraduate chapter partnered with SNAP, the Student Nursing Association of Pennsylvania, to achieve this goal—raising more \$82,523 for THON and to help kids like our THON children, Maddie Hill and Cora Beyer. THON's support allows the Four Diamonds Fund to provide innovative cancer research and help offset the cost of treatment that insurance does not cover.

#### Chapter of Excellence

Phi Kappa Tau was recently named a "2011 Chapter of Excellence" by the staff of the Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life. This designation is given to only a select few fraternities that meet the high standards of recognition. Some of the qualifications of this award include attendance at programming events, community service and participation in Greek events and philanthropy. Hopefully Omicron Chapter can build on this honor and use it as a springboard for future success.

#### **Dues and Improvements**

The Dues Program has been an integral part in supporting our Chapter and providing benefits to alumni such as the *Omicronicle*, the Room and Ticket program, Homecoming activities, and our website, **www.pktomicron.com**.

Alumni-sponsored improvements to the Chapter House over the past few years have been a key component to successful recruitment. This year, the BOD once again put your contributions to work into lasting improvements to our physical plant. Among other projects, we've replaced the side patio door, added new letters to the front of the house, upgraded the internet service, and added gutter guards.

# **BROTHERS HONORED**

## **Honoring Brothers Fallen in Vietnam**

During the recent '50s reunion weekend at Omicron, a plaque was unveiled to honor the two brothers who were killed while serving in Vietnam: William Ward Nichols '58 and John Richard Fischer '61. Bro. Nichols was an Army Captain and a graduate of the Army Ranger School. He was killed in October 1965 by small arms fire while leading a patrol. His body was recovered and he was buried in New Jersey. Bro. Fischer was a Marine Corps First Lieutenant, and a A-4 Sky Hawk pilot.

In September 1966, Bro. Fischer crashed while providing close air support to a Marine platoon under attack by a large enemy force. His wrecked plane was found a few days later, but his body was never recovered. He was subsequently declared killed in action.

The plaque is similar to the one currently in place for the Omicrons who died in World War II and will be installed near it in the chapter house library.

# **Perserving our Heritage and Storied Legacy Online**

Thanks to the efforts of David Lapinski, Omicron is launching on new webseries highlighting the storied legacy of Phi Kappa Tau at Penn State. And so our early history goes...

"The chapter moved into a house owed by Charles Foster at 234 S. Fraser Street...Brothers' monthly fees included rent at \$12.00, food program at \$16.00, dues of \$1.00 whether living in the house or not and special assessments ranging from \$0.75 to \$5.00 to cover

'social activities'...

The social calendar consisted of 'house parties', smokers, dances, a formal dinner dance and a stag banquet. The chapter often had to rent space at a local hall to host its larger functions. In many cases 'dates' had to be recruited from hometowns for the dances. When this occurred, the brothers would move out of the chapter house and the 'dates' moved in for the weekend...

From the beginning, Omicron wanted a home of its own. It was the

'Dad's Association' that made a down payment on three lots located on Garner Street. The total land cost was \$2,717.00 and construction started in early 1929..."
